

Why are the bison rounded up?

The Buffalo Roundup is part of Custer State Park's management plan to maintain a healthy balance between the number of bison and the available rangeland forage. The park can only sustain a certain number of bison, based on the condition of the grassland and how much food is available. The Buffalo Roundup also allows for some of the animals to be sorted out of the herd, approximately 200 are to be sold, vaccinate the new herd. It takes about four days to complete the roundup.

AN ARM CHAIR CHAT WITH HAROLD WASS

AGE 104

At age 104, Harold is the oldest member of First Covenant Church. Harold was born at the Manson Hospital, 11th Street, Worthington. After country school he went to the Worthington High School and his class had 65

students. Their graduation ceremony was at the Presbyterian Church and their Junior/Senior banquet was held in the Masonic Temple.

Harold played in the Band. Pictured here in his band uniform and instrument! The band won two State Championships. .

Harold said, "He was baptized as an infant into the Covenant Church...then called the Swedish

Mission Church." Here is Harold with his siblings..... all ready to go to church. Pictured are Clarence Wass, Marian Weigenant, and Harold.

Notice their knickerbockers worn at that time! (Pauline Nickel is the daughter of Mabel Soderholm, Harold's older sister) Harold said, "At one time all six Wass' and their spouses attended the Covenant church." Harold speaks fluent Swedish and said the Beacon Class in church had 30 members and were very active in the church.

Harold Married Thelma in the parsonage of the Norwegian Lutheran Church in Adrian. They were blessed with two daughters and a son. Daughter Nancy Flynn is a member here. Patri-

cia lives in Laurens, IA and Tom lives in Sioux Falls, SD

They farmed 4 miles North of Bigelow together with his brother, Clarence. They farmed 500 acres with horses and a small John Deere tractor with a two bottom plow. They used 8 horses on two cultivators. It wasn't until Harold was 30 years old before they had running water on the farm. Harold said they had 300 feeder cattle which they bought in the west and fed out on their farm, plus 300 to 400 head of hogs and about 200 chickens. They

butchered 1 steer and 2 hogs each year for their food supply. They were on the farm for 42 years before moving into town. After retirement they traveled 125,000 miles to all states ex-

cept Alaska.


His Dad's car was a Hudson Super 6. They only drove it in the summer time and in the winter time they still used the horse and sleigh to go to church and town. Harold's first car was an old Model T.

When asked what some of the big changes were in his lifetime Harold mentioned the telephone. He said, "We had the wall phone and you turned the

crank on the side of the box to make a call. Their number was 1 long ring and 2 short rings. His parents ring was 1 long, 1 short and 1 long." Today the phone has evolved into the hand held "smart phone". Television was another big change in his life. There are over 200 new inventions in his life

time such as the pop up toaster, Electric Razor, Electric power drill, Kodak digital cameras, the coat zipper, Television in 2004, Radio tuners, Aerosol cans, power steering, hearing aids, and many more!

Harold thinks things in the world will not change for the better until Christ Comes!


